James 1:19-27, our Text

vs. 26-27 - Title
Hasty talk and anger are often expressions of worldliness still in our hearts. How can we get rid of moral filth and evil?- vs. 21
The Greek word for "moral filth" can also be translated as "impurity." It means having mixed motives, some from the world and some from Scripture. James calls us to get rid of our world impurities.
Very important: "Slow action" does Not mean "no action!" The proper approach to God's Word is demonstrated in vs. 22-25
